
Enhancements to our online platforms, including the launch of a new website and a podcast series, have broadened our reach and deepened our engagement with relevant partners worldwide.

# COLLECTIVE ACTION LEARNING

**Strategy Objective 1** 



### **OBJECTIVE**

To facilitate collective action learning for the generation of solutions, strategies, and best practices to systematically integrate youth partnership across the Adolescent and Youth Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (AYSRHR) ecosystem.

### **OUR PROGRESS**

We successfully completed four action learning cycles, collaborating with 31 diverse organisations. Our members, composed of international non-governmental organisations (INGOs), academics, expert consultants, local civil society organisations, and dynamic youth-led organisations representing.

# **Online Community**

Our Action Learning Online Community empowered organisations to participate in our action learning groups, so no one was left behind. Hosted on the IBP Network Platform, the community boasted 68 dedicated individuals in 2023. It featured a suite of tools and activities designed to stimulate engagement, facilitate learning, and promote networking among its members. Notably, our discussion forums and peer learning groups were key to active knowledge exchange.

### **MY SRH Initiative**

In July 2023, we joined forces with Metrics for Management (M4M) at the Women Deliver Conference in Kigali. Our mission? To facilitate an Action Learning Workshop for their Measuring Youth Sexual and Reproductive Health (MY SRH) Initiative. Led by our incredible team, we simulated an adaptation of the collective action learning process. This immersive experience granted us valuable insights into the context of the issue, helping us to clearly define our priorities.



# The Hub has facilitated the collaboration of 31 organisations in 2023.

We established the goal of having at least 30% of our members being youth-organisations, the actual amount was 60%.

Participating in the Action Learning Group helped Rutgers map how we measure and report meaningful and inclusive youth participation in Rutgers' different programmes and check back with partners on what is most useful for them. We used the YIELD Theory of Change to structure that overview and identify gaps. This resulted in a fantastic resource where the colleagues and our partners can click on an area of interest or domain they are working on to access existing tools they can further adapt for their purposes. It really helped to have the YIELD action learning group to help drive this work. I found it very inspiring to exchange with others and learn from them. The YIELD hub staff did an excellent job encouraging us to be curious about each other's work and creating an atmosphere of mutuality.





After completing the Action Learning Cycle and with help from YIELD Hub, we have hired a consultant to develop an adolescent and youth strategy, and is working on revamping the ,We Trust Youth' initiative to financially support youthled activities. We are also providing technical assistance and training to youth focal points, and have successfully lobbied for 40% of funding to go to youth-led organisations to focus on youth empowerment and capacity building.



# Compensating Youth Work

After joining Action Learning Cycle 3, I attended the PATA 2023 Summit, where we discussed youth work compensation and peer supporter sustainability. Key concerns were identified, such as inadequate compensation and a lack of sustainability beyond 24 years. To address this, we recommend government support for a minimum of two peer supporters per facility. Currently, I am leading an initiative to gather data on trained peer supporters in our region and propose the formalisation of the programme through a letter to the government.

To serve as the go-to platform for global cross-stakeholder alignment, coordination, and collaboration on youth partnership in the AYSRHR ecosystem.


### **OUR PROGRESS**

### We've made significant strides in our content creation efforts.

This progress is largely due to the increased activity of our Action Learning Groups, which form the foundation of our knowledge management and learning activation. Furthermore, the expansion of our specialised communications team has also contributed to this success. We've created and distributed over 40 different user-friendly resources through various online and in-person channels. Our content, which includes videos, audio recordings, and written materials, ensures a broad reach. Importantly, our efforts have led to a growing presence on social media, marked by increased insights and engagement.

These include a secondary navigation tab for easy access to our latest news, media, and resources, and the addition of a Spotify icon to promote our newly launched podcast channel on Youth Partnership. 

# Unleashing the Power of Action Learning: a practical guide



# A Passion for Action: Advancing Gender Equity and Intersectionality through Collective Action Learning


In 2022, we launched our first Collective Action



In 2023, we revisited the original YIELD ToC, first published in 2020, to assess its relevance three years post-publication. We sought input from Action Learning Group members for this review. This ToC is intended to serve the AYSRHR field, its indicators becoming operational when adopted by organisations in their strategies, work plans, and programs. We conducted interviews with 33 organisations across five action-learning cycles to understand how relevant the YIELD Hub Theory of Change and its indicators are to good practices and emerging trends in youth engagement.

# **The Youth Partnership Podcast**

We successfully launched and completed the first season of our Youth Partnership Podcast, comprising five episodes. Created to incorporate more diverse voices into the YIELD Hub's continuous action learning cycles, this podcast intends to enliven the action learning process. Season 1 gives our audience

a glimpse into the discussions that take place during these cycles. It also provides an opportunity to actively participate in relevant issues, thereby fostering norm change within the AYSRHR ecosystem.





# **EVENTS**

### **IBP Partners Meeting**

We co-hosted a session on enhancing Youth Partnership within the IBP Network with the Young and Alive Initiative.

### **WD2023**

We partnered with CIFF, PMNCH, Rutgers, the Ouagadougou Partnership, CHOICE, and Engender Health at the Women Deliver 2023 Conference. We facilitated group discussions and launched our first Action Learning Toolkit and 2022 Annual Report.

### **UNGA**

We participated in the World Contraception Day webinar and the Generation Equality Forum Midpoint Moment.

### **Global Forum for Adolescents**

We collaborated with youth-led organisations to co-host a session on meaningful engagement of adolescents and youth.

# **Shaping Foreign Feminist Policy Conference**

We aimed to strengthen Dutch partnerships, understand their priorities, and network with potential Action Learning Groups partners.

# CSO Forum - 7th Asian and Pacific Population Conference

Supported by UNFPA Asia Pacific Region, we connected with SRHR Advocates, Youth-Led organizations, and CSOs in the Asia Pacific region.

### **Clinton Global Initiative**

At this year's Clinton Global Initiative, we emphasised the urgent need to prioritise youth partnerships to advance adolescent health and well-being. We support organisations to put into practice their own commitments to strengthening youth partnerships.
